AT EACH K of C MEETING WE LISTEN TO THE READING OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING, AND THEN VOTE TO APPROVE THEM. THE INTERESTING AND GOOD THAT HAPPENED AT THOSE MEETINGS IS THUS A MATTER OF RECORD, WHICH IS SELDOM READ AS IT IS BURIED IN THE LARGER PART OF THE MINUTES WHICH TEND TO READ AS A REPEAT OF THE PREVIOUS MONTH; ROLL CALL, COMMITTEE REPORTS, ETC. THIS HISTORY WAS COMPILED, USING FILE COPIES OF LETTERS, THE MINUTES OF MEETINGS AND THE MONTHLY NEWSLETTER, **THE ENCYCLICAL**, AS SOURCES OF INFORMATION.

THERE ARE NO ISSUES OF **THE ENCYCLICAL** ON FILE BEFORE 1967 AND ONLY 11 ISSUES FROM 1968 TO 1972, THEN NONE EXCEPT FOR APRIL, 1979, UNTIL JUNE, 1980, AFTER WHICH ONLY A FEW ISSUES ARE MISSING. IF YOU HAVE AN OLD COLLECTION OF **THE ENCYCLICAL**, PLEASE LET US KNOW SO COPIES CAN BE MADE TO FILL IN THE ASSEMBLY FILE.

EACH OF THE FILES OF SOURCES OF INFORMATION HAS HOLES IN IT. IF YOU RECALL ANY ADDITIONAL DETAILS AS YOU READ THIS HISTORY, PLEASE SUBMIT THEM IN WRITING. THEY WILL BE FILED WITH THIS HISTORY AND ITS SOURCES, TO BE CONSIDERED IN FUTURE UPDATES. A DOS FORMAT FLOPPY DISK OF THIS HISTORY HAS ALSO BEEN FILED FOR SUCH UPDATES.

AS THE FIRST FAITHFUL SCRIBE OF OUR ASSEMBLY, I HAVE ALWAYS BEEN INTERESTED IN THE RECORDS OF OUR ASSEMBLY. IN THIS OUR THIRTIETH ANNIVERSARY YEAR, I WAS SUDDENLY RETIRED FROM A QUARTER CENTURY OF EMPLOYMENT AS AN ELECTRICAL ENGINEER AT GRUMMAN AND SO FOUND THE TIME TO FURTHER MY INTEREST IN AND LOVE OF OUR ASSEMBLY AND COMPILE THIS HISTORY OF OUR ASSEMBLY. I ADOPTED THE FORMAT THAT OUR THEN FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR ROBERT BAILLIE, USED IN COMPILING THE HISTORY OF THE DELANEY COUNCIL, IN WHICH THE INFORMATION REPORTED IS LIMITED TO ONE PAGE PER FRATERNAL YEAR. THIS FORMAT HELPS MAKE IT INTERESTING READING AND ALLOWS EASY USE OF THIS COMPILATION AS A REFERENCE WORK.

EACH OF OUR MEMBERS HAS A LOVE OF AND A

LOYALTY TO HIS COUNCIL, AS WELL AS TO OUR ASSEMBLY. NEVERTHELESS, IN THE ASSEMBLY WE ARE A FAMILY AND SUPPORT EACH OTHER IN COUNCIL ACTIVITIES WHEN THE OPPORTUNITY IS PRESENTED. TO SHOW THIS COUNCIL DIVERSITY, THE FORMAT FOR LISTS OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES HAS EACH NAME FOLLOWED BY A COUNCIL NUMBER. IN THE CHOICE OF THE INFORMATION REPORTED, FAIRNESS TO ALL MEMBERS AND COUNCILS WAS A GOAL.

IN ADDITION TO THE MINUTES OF MOST OF THE MEETINGS, MANY OF THE SIGN-IN LISTS FROM THE MEETINGS ARE ALSO ON FILE. THE NAMES RECORDED AT EACH MEETING, FOR EACH COUNCIL, WERE CAREFULLY COUNTED AND WERE COMPILED INTO CHARTS TO GIVE AN INDICATION OF EACH COUNCIL'S ATTENDANCE ACTIVITY IN THE ASSEMBLY OVER THE YEARS.

EVERY AVAILABLE SOURCE OF INFORMATION WAS ALSO USED TO CREATE A FILE OF EVERYONE WHO WAS EVER A MEMBER OF OUR ASSEMBLY AND THE EXEMPLIFICATION DATES IN THAT FILE WERE COUNTED AND COMPILED INTO CHARTS TO FURTHER GIVE AN INDICATION OF EACH COUNCIL'S INCREASE IN ACTIVITY IN THE ASSEMBLY.

BOTH THE ATTENDANCE AND THE EXEMPLIFICATION CHARTS ARE INCLUDED IN THIS HISTORY AS AN APPENDIX, BUT THE FILE OF EVERYONE WHO WAS EVER A MEMBER OF OUR ASSEMBLY WOULD ALMOST DOUBLE THE NUMBER OF PAGES OF THIS HISTORY AND WAS NOT INCLUDED. INSTEAD, A COPY OF EACH COUNCIL PORTION OF THAT FILE HAS BEEN GIVEN TO EACH OF THE COUNCIL'S FOURTH DEGREE CHAIRMEN. THE COMPLETE FILE IS CARRIED BY THE FAITHFUL COMPTROLLER TO ALL MEETINGS, TO MAKE IT AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION. A COPY OF THE COMPLETE FILE OR ANY COUNCIL PORTION THEREOF IS AVAILABLE ON REQUEST FOR THE COST OF COPYING.

1962-1963

THE YEAR OF THE FORMATION OF FIVE ASSEMBLIES, WHERE THERE

WERE TWO

Supreme Master William J. Mulligan, in a letter written to Master James P. McHugh of our District, stated:

"In my report submitted to the Supreme Assembly in Boston, Massachusetts in August, 1962, I stressed the fact that Assemblies should not be too large in membership and that more Assemblies should be created. ...Therefore, in my opinion, you should create three additional assemblies in your district and split the fifty-two Councils [with 2,700 Fourth Degree members] which now comprise your jurisdiction." Then, this letter dated May 28, 1962, gave the money solution: "With reference to the division of funds, it can be said that Assembly funds are actually the property of each and every member and using this theory as a basis for a simple solution, the funds would be apportioned on a per capita basis."

On July 6, 1963, an Assembly officers meeting of the Ninth NY District was then held at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Council clubhouse in Lindenhurst to read and discuss the contents of a June 7, 1963 letter written by Master James P. McHugh to all 2,700 Sir Knights of the 9th NY District. In it he listed the five Assemblies which now make up the Ninth NY District and also the Councils whose members are assigned to each of them effective in Nassau as of 6/26/63 and in Suffolk as of 6/12/63. He also listed the appointed organizing chairmen of the three new Assemblies. He stated that the assets of the two existing Assemblies were frozen as of June 6, 1963, pending

distribution as outlined in the Supreme Master's directive letter of May 28th.

The 2,324 members and \$16,819.11 assets (including dues receivable) from Cardinal Mercier Assembly were subsequently distributed as follows:

On July 10, 1963, the first meeting of the "Mid-Nassau" Assembly was held by organizing chairman SK John J. Hehir at Hempstead Council #1241. At it:

The W. Master read a letter from GK John Serenci, 1241, suggesting "Pope John XXIII" as the Assembly name. After a lengthy discussion this suggestion was made into a motion and approved. A motion for a By-Laws Committee with each of the Councils represented on it was also approved. The following SK's were then appointed to the By-Laws Committee: George Muller, Chairman, 2345

The question of a regular meeting night was then discussed and a motion was made and carried for the second Wednesday of each month.

A letter reporting on this first meeting and announcing the subsequent organizational meetings, was signed by the W. Master and the organizing chairman and sent to all the members.

On August 14, 1963, 80 members attended the second Mid-Nassau Assembly meeting @ 1241. At it:

The nominating committee presented their list of proposed officers.

The W. Master read correspondence between the Supreme Board of Directors and himself in regard to the permanent name of our Assembly. In answer to the request that our Assembly be named Pope John XXIII, Supreme asked that a brief write-up of the person whose name we suggested be submitted.

The W. Master then advised that an Assembly can be named after a living person and that the North-Nassau Assembly had submitted Bishop Kellenberg name along with seven other names, thus the matter

of selection there, had been tabled. He also reported that he had received a letter from the Bishop asking that the Mid-Nassau Assembly be named after him.

Motion to reconsider our name was then tabled and the Worthy Master was asked to meet with the Bishop and show him the letter he had received from SK Serenci asking that the Assembly be named Pope John XXIII. This resulted in the Bishop glad to have the North-Nassau Assembly take his name.

Again a letter was sent by the Worthy Master and the organizing chairman, to all the members giving the report of the Nominating Committee and the other happenings at the meeting and announcing the next meeting, Election of Officers.

On Sept. 11, 1963, 148 members attended the third Mid-Nassau Assembly meeting @ 1241. At it: The W. Master conducted the Election of Officers. There were two nominations from the floor; SK Harry Cunningham, 3581, for FN and SK Tom Russo, 4422, for F Pilot. The result of the FN vote was very close. All Officers recommended by the Nominating Committee were elected.

The By-Laws committee reported on the progress of formulating a rough draft at their meeting.

The first regular business meeting was announced to be held on October 9. There was a rising vote of thanks for a job well done by organizing Chairman SK John Hehir and the meeting was closed with prayer by the newly elected

FN.

On Sept. 29, 1963, the Installation of Officers was held at Hempstead Council # 1241, for all three Nassau County Assemblies at a cost of \$278.55 per Assembly.

Oct. Meeting @ 3005, FN stated that although Rules of Order call for Lord's Prayer, meeting was opened with a Rosary due to tradition of our meetings at Cardinal Mercier Assembly. A consensus of opinion was then taken, with majority in favor of saying a Rosary and minority in favor of leaving it to discretion of the chair.

Nov. Meeting @ 4422, By-Laws were approved, committee, George Muller, William Duschenchuk and Michael Hannan. A statement exempting 65 year old 25 year members from dues was deleted during approval. Dues was set at \$5.00 per year, Chalice fund of fifty cents included. Meeting time was

set for the fourth Wednesday of each month. The W Master expressed regret that our new meeting night is a conflict for him, with that of Cardinal Mercier Ass'y.

Christmas Party Meeting @ 3488, 12/28/63 Tickets at \$5.00 per person, a bottle of Rye or Scotch per table of ten.

Jan. Meeting @ 5033, called to order late (9:15 PM) due to dues collections. Report of Christmas Party, sale of tickets \$698.00, expenses \$ 838.58, cost to Assembly \$135.58. Winner of name the monthly bulletin contest, SK Norbert Wengler, 3581, given free dues for year and a Madonna ceramic bust statuette. W. Master

reported that he talked to Supreme Sect'y Joe Lamb; a member is justified in refusal to give third degree password to a Fourth Degree officer, but it is a courtesy in place of showing the third degree travel card to attend a meeting, etc.

Feb Meeting @ 3581, Speaker, introduced by former colleague SK Matthew Brady was Judge Eugene Loughlin, who suggested the K of C start a Big Brother movement in Nassau County. Annual Memorial Mass, 2/22/64, report; less than 100 SK's and 50 from their families attended. Motion to pledge \$1800 (@ \$60 per month) to the Diocesan HS Building Fund, having been published was voted and passed.

March Meeting @ 2852, A bill for ten Fourth Degree emblem Rosaries, \$12.50.

First Annual Communion Breakfast was held on Sunday May 3, 1964 at Antoine's Gallatoires at the Vatican Pavilion of the NY Worlds Fair. Tickets cost \$5.25 per person. The Mass was celebrated by our Faithful Friar and the speaker was Lt. Col. E. Parmley, IV, of the United States Military Academy. The Honored Guests included the Supreme Knight, the State Deputy, the Chapter Chairman, the Master of the 1st NY District, our own Master and all 5 FN's from our District.

April Meeting @ 3488, Letter announcing Bi-ennial District Meeting was read.

May Meeting @ 1241, Newsletter costs per month, Printing 600 copies \$58.00, Addressing, sorting, tying and mailing @ \$6.00, returns \$.08 each.

Exemplification, June 7, 1964 at Statler Hilton, \$30.00, with one banquet ticket.

June Meeting @ 2852, Letter from SK Tom O'Connor was read, he thanked us for visit in hospital and for Rosary Beads then given to him. Color Corps reported 30 men now in uniform. F Purser, \$3,015 balance on hand. Elections were held with no contests. FN spoke about Pope John XXIII and thanked SK Serenci for picking and promoting the name.

July Meeting @ 4422, Pilgrimage will be on 9/20/64, cost of bus \$6.25 and Assembly will supply box lunch.

August Meeting @ 3581, Sweepstakes, drawing 7/26/64, only 248 of 400 tickets were sold, at \$5 each. This gave us income of only \$1240 of possible \$2000, as prizes totaled \$1000 as advertised, we netted only \$240 of which \$7.50 was needed to print the tickets.

Sept. Meeting @ 3488, Installation of Officers, Benediction at St. Martha's Church. Pilgrimage report, two busloads, receipts \$324, expenses \$330.

Oct. Meeting @ 3005, Budget was accepted as published. Talk on Ecumenism and the changes to the Liturgy was given by SK Rev. McMahon SJ.

Nov. Meeting @ 3488, a letter from

seminarian Gerald Albright to whom we had donated \$300.00 was read, he was running better than a B+ average. There was a free raffle of one turkey and of ten pairs of mince and pumpkin pies. Motion to increase the dues to \$7.50, effective 1/1/65, so as to balance the budget, was approved as published. An amendment to limit this increase to two years, until the \$60 per month for the HS Building Fund pledge is paid up, was not seconded and thus not voted.

Christmas Party Meeting @ 1241, \$5.00 per person.

Jan. Meeting @ 4422, By-Laws Committee John R. Strachan, Dalton R. Miller, William Duschenchuk to amended to allow substitution of other suitable religious articles in place of Chalice for deceased SK's. Honor Guard uniform (cape & chapeaux) cost is \$56.00. We had 38 Guardsmen as

of March 1965.

Feb. Meeting @ 5033, Christmas party report, income was \$1070, profit of \$60 was donated to the Nursing Sisters, per a previous motion.

March Meeting @ 1241, Nominating committee appointed by FN, about half are also Council Chairmen. The Assembly purchased an American flag and a Papal flag at a cost of \$138.00

Communion Breakfast 4/25/65, 5:00 PM Mass, 6:30 supper at Hempstead Council, Fruit Cup, Pot Roast, Red Cabbage, Potato Dumplings, Dessert and Beverage at \$3.75 per person.

April Meeting @ 1241, F Purser reported \$3727.67 on deposit. FN commented on correction of previous erosion of money on deposit before dues increase.

May Meeting @ 3488, Sacred vessels motion to amend the By-Laws having been duly published was carried unanimously.

June Meeting @ 3005, Election of Officers, 3 way race for Inner Sentinel, 2 way race for Outer Sentinel. F. Capt. presented a "Silver Knight" as an attendance award to Holy Innocents Council Chairman, who then presented it to SK Gassler, GK. Pilgrimage report, busses at \$3.00 per person to leave Hempstead at 9:00 AM Sun. Aug. 8, to shrine of Don Bosco.

they can nominate delegates to the Bi-ennial Meeting of the district. W Master congratulated us for a large turnout on such a stormy snowy night.

Feb. Meeting @ 3581, Report on wake of Guardsman SK Gene Ballweg, 8 Guardsmen attended each night, Fri. through Sun. and as pallbearers at funeral. At Pinelawn, they performed a flag ritual, removed it from coffin, folded and presented it to Mrs. Theresa Ballweg. Guardsmen received Citations. Report on PFN Dinner by SK Miller, 109 tickets for \$1090.00 income, less 101 dinners \$1051.49 and expenses of

\$80.27, for a cost to Assembly of \$41.76. Communion Breakfast report, all urged to go, April 17, 1966. F Friar spoke as to how he enjoyed the meeting and now appreciates how hard the pews seem to get during a long sermon.

March Meeting @ 1241, Talk on legal problems associated with the moral problem of Indecent Literature, by D. A. Cahn. F. Comptroller reported \$1522.50 dues collected since last meeting.

April Meeting @ 3005, Chairman SK Caprio reported on Essay contest, letters mailed in April, to all Catholic Schools in Nassau County,
